## Lundquist Fellows Program - Frequently Asked Questions

### ***Who is eligible to apply?***

Any current 8th grade student who is attending a Partnership for Los Angeles Schools middle school (Carver, Hollenbeck, Markham, or Stevenson) is eligible to apply to the Lundquist Fellows program.

### ***How long is the program?***

Students begin participation in the program in the fall of their 8th grade year through their 12th grade year as long as they continue to attend a Partnership for Los Angeles Schools middle or high school.

### ***Which schools are part of the Partnership Network?***

The Partnership network includes 18 schools in the communities of Watts, South LA, and Boyle Heights. Our secondary schools include Carver MS, Hollenbeck MS, Markham MS, Stevenson MS, Santee Education Complex, Roosevelt HS, Math, Science, and Technology Magnet Academy at Roosevelt (MSTMA), Mendez HS, and Jordan HS.

### ***What happens if I change schools?***

If you change to another Partnership for Los Angeles Schools campus, you can continue to participate. If you change to a campus outside of the network, you are no longer eligible to participate. However, you can still receive the scholarship for the years that you participated.

### ***Is there any cost to participating?***

No. All costs (including housing, food, and transportation for all program events including the Oregon trip) are covered by the Partnership for Los Angeles Schools with generous support from Richard and Melanie Lundquist.

The following events occur on an annual basis for the entirety of a Fellow's participation in the program outside of school time:

- Orientation for newly admitted students and their parents/guardian
- Week-long Summer Program at the University of Oregon (rising 9th - 12th graders only)
- Partnership University Day - Fellows and their parents visit a university in the Los Angeles area.
- Career Day Field Trip - Fellows meet a professional and learn about their job and career path
- Celebration Luncheon with Richard & Melanie Lundquist



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Scholarships are received at the end of each school year so long as the student fulfills all requirements of the program during that year.

***What is the Oregon Young Scholars Program (OYSP) and who is it for?***

Participants in OYSP are chosen from schools that serve students who are most underserved in higher education. The program focuses on providing this opportunity to students of color, students from homes with limited incomes, and students who are the first in their families to be college bound.

The goals of the Oregon Young Scholars Program are:

- To develop and challenge the academic skills and college preparation of historically underrepresented students;
- To increase interest in college and the enrollment of African-American, Asian, Pacific Islander, Latinx and Native American students, needs-based students, and other underrepresented students at the University of Oregon, and other colleges and universities;
- To build a cadre of young scholars who will participate in academic, social, community and cultural activities that increase their ability to flourish in an educational setting, improve study and analytical skills across the disciplines of writing, arts and sciences, and apply new lessons to their lives;
- To increase the interest of parents/families in higher education and encourage increased communication with teachers and administrators;
- To promote active civic engagement through volunteer experiences and lifelong learning;
- To foster a sense of community that is safe and accountable.

***What do students do at the Oregon Young Scholars Program?***

Besides having fun and building life-long friendships, all scholars will have writing and math classes. Students will divide into cohorts covering a wide range of subjects covering STEM



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subjects, the arts, social justice, business, and other alternating subjects. Scholars also participate in recreational activities and selected workshops.

During the week, there will be a Community and Networking Dinner where professors, University of Oregon administrators, community business owners, and other prominent figures/mentors will socialize and dine with our scholars.

On the final day, scholars will present their tangible projects and oral presentations to their parents, professors, and invited guests.

There will be lots of work and lots of fun!

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## Programa para Becarios de Lundquist (Lundquist Fellows) - Preguntas Más Frecuentes

### ***¿Quién puede presentar una solicitud?***

Cualquier estudiante que actualmente esté en el 8° grado de una escuela secundaria de Partnership for Los Angeles Schools (Carver, Hollenbeck, Markham, o Stevenson) puede presentar una solicitud para entrar en el programa de Becarios de Lundquist.

### ***¿Cuánto tiempo dura el programa?***

Los estudiantes comienzan a participar en el programa en el otoño del 8° grado hasta el año del 12° grado, siempre y cuando continúen asistiendo a una escuela secundaria o de bachillerato de Partnership for Los Angeles Schools.

### ***¿Qué escuelas forman parte de la red de Partnership?***

La red de Partnership incluye a 19 escuelas en las comunidades de Watts, el sur de Los Ángeles y Boyle Heights. Nuestras escuelas secundarias son Carver MS; Hollenbeck MS; Markham MS; Stevenson MS; Santee Education Complex; Roosevelt HS; Math, Science, and Technology Magnet Academy en Roosevelt (MSTMA); Mendez HS y Jordan HS.

### ***¿Qué ocurre si me cambio de escuela?***

Si te cambias a otra escuela de Partnership for Los Angeles Schools, puedes continuar participando. Si te cambias a una escuela que no pertenezca a la red, ya no reunirás los requisitos para participar. Sin embargo, aun así puedes recibir la beca por los años en los que participaste.

### ***¿Se tiene que pagar algo para participar?***

No. Partnership for Los Angeles Schools cubre todos los costos (incluidos el alojamiento, la comida y el transporte a todos los eventos del programa, que incluye el viaje a Oregón) con la generosa ayuda de Richard y Melanie Lundquist.

Los siguientes eventos se realizan anualmente durante toda la participación del becario en el programa fuera del horario escolar:

- Orientación para los estudiantes recién admitidos y sus padres o tutores
- Programa de verano de una semana de duración en la University of Oregon (sólo para estudiantes de 9° a 12° grados)
- Día de Universidad (University Day) de Partnership: los becarios y sus padres visitan una universidad en el área de Los Ángeles.
- Excursión del Día del Profesional (Career Day): los becarios conocen a un profesional y aprenden sobre su trabajo y su carrera profesional.
- Almuerzo de celebración con Richard y Melanie Lundquist

### ***¿Qué es el Programa de Oregón para Becarios Jóvenes (Oregon Young Scholars Program - OYSP) y a quién va dirigido?***

Los participantes del programa OYSP se eligen entre las escuelas que sirven a los estudiantes más necesitados de una educación superior. El programa se centra en ofrecer esta oportunidad a los estudiantes de color, a los estudiantes procedentes de hogares con ingresos limitados y a los estudiantes que son los primeros de su familia en ir a la universidad.

Los objetivos del Programa de Oregón para Becarios Jóvenes son:

- Desarrollar y desafiar las habilidades académicas y la preparación universitaria de los estudiantes históricamente infrarrepresentados;
- Aumentar el interés por la universidad y la inscripción de estudiantes afroamericanos, asiáticos, de las islas del Pacífico, latinx y nativos americanos, estudiantes con necesidades y otros estudiantes infrarrepresentados en la University of Oregón y en otras universidades;
- Crear un grupo de jóvenes becarios que participarán en actividades académicas, sociales, comunitarias y culturales para aumentar su capacidad de prosperar en un entorno educativo, mejorar sus habilidades analíticas y de estudio en todas las disciplinas de la escritura, las artes y las ciencias, y aplicar lo que han aprendido a sus vidas;
- Aumentar el interés de los padres y las familias en la educación superior y fomentar una mayor comunicación con los profesores y administradores;
- Promover el compromiso cívico activo a través de experiencias de voluntariado y aprendizaje permanente;
- Fomentar un sentido de comunidad que sea seguro y responsable.

### ***¿Qué hacen los estudiantes en el Programa de Oregón para Becarios Jóvenes?***

Además de divertirse y crear amistades para toda la vida, todos los becarios tendrán clases de escritura y matemáticas. Los estudiantes se dividirán en cohortes que cubrirán una amplia



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gama de asignaturas que abarcan las asignaturas de STEM (ciencias, tecnología, ingeniería y matemáticas), las artes, la justicia social, los negocios y otras asignaturas alternativas. Los becarios también participarán en actividades recreativas y talleres seleccionados.

Durante la semana, habrá una cena de la comunidad y de la red (Community and Networking Dinner) donde los profesores, los administradores de la University of Oregon, los dueños de negocios de la comunidad, y otras figuras prominentes o mentores socializarán y cenarán con nuestros becarios.

El último día, los alumnos presentarán sus proyectos concretos y sus presentaciones orales a sus padres, profesores e invitados.
