From Recovery to Acceleration

Executive Summary - 2025 Annual Impact Report



California's 2025 state assessment results show powerful momentum across Los Angeles Unified. Year-over-year growth is outpacing the state, and students are now performing above prepandemic levels.

This momentum is fueled in part by gains in Partnership co-managed LAUSD schools, where we develop exceptional leaders, invest in excellent teaching, and partner with families and communities to expand opportunity for Black, Latinx, and multilingual learners.

Top Takeaways



More students are reaching grade-level proficiency than ever.

Grade-level proficiency increased by 6 points in math and 4 in literacy.



Students are gaining real ground toward grade-level proficiency.

Schools moved 1.5x faster toward grade-level than LAUSD overall.



Partnership schools are rising relative to LAUSD.

Schools climbed from the 38th to the 45th percentile in math, and from the 38th to the 41st in literacy.

More students are reaching gradelevel proficiency than at any point in our network's history.


In 2025, grade-level proficiency increased by 6 points in math and 4 points in literacy.

Literacy
37% of students reached grade-level
proficiency in literacy

Math
27% of students reached gradelevel proficiency in math



Distance from Grade-Level Proficiency (DFS) and Gains in 2025



Students are gaining real ground toward grade-level proficiency.

In 2025, Partnership schools advanced 1.5x faster in literacy and math.

Elementary schools drove the strongest acceleration (more than 2x) in both literacy and math.

DFS points show how many scale score points students are below (or above) grade level. Gains indicate students, on average, are moving closer to (or beyond) proficiency.

Equity impact:

Students furthest from opportunity are making progress toward proficiency.

More students are moving out of the lowest band — and into new possibilities.




2025 Academic ResultsFrom Recovery to Acceleration
